**Anthony Barker** is Associate Professor in the DLC of the UA, coordinator of a Cultural Studies research line and currently a member of the Department's executive. Born north of London in 1954, he obtained a D.Phil. at Oxford in 18th-century literature and was Munby Fellow in Bibliography at Cambridge University in 1981-2. He was director of the Master course on Languages and Business and is vice-coordinator of the Doctoral Program in Cultural Studies. He now teaches film, literary and cultural disciplines and English for academic purposes. He publishes in these areas. Earlier work includes collections on Europe and Stereotyping, and articles on drama, the 50s, American and British road movies, and British film and television comedy. Most recent works include articles on zany film and television comedy, ultra-violence in the cinema of the 1970s and films about bridges. He is currently editing a book on peripheral theatres of and micro-narratives from the First World War.
